# Regional Assessment



1) Whether and how RA information and analysis will transfer to, and be influential in, subsequent project IAs (conduct, scoping) has yet to be tested in practice





2) RA is a better mechanism for assessing (and potentially managing) cumulative effects compared to project IAs alone – But the same complexities and analytical challenges will exist at the regional level





3) RA-provided information, analysis and "context" can help support cumulative effects assessments in subsequent project IAs – But does not improve their ability to manage regional cumulative effects





4) A key RA objective / outcome is the identification of "beyond project-level" approaches for managing complex and pervasive regional issues, and for making recommendations to the appropriate responsible authorities (governments)





5) RAs are likely to be most effective and influential where they have clear and established connections to *both* existing regional planning initiatives *and* project IA processes



6) Even with clear links between RA and regional planning, there are challenges if neither process establishes an overall vision for future development, or where there is a lack of specificity in RA outputs and how they are planned to be used
